### **Featured Speaker and Facilitator of Roundtable Discussion – Dan Murphy M.A., CFE, CFCI**

Dan is currently the Director of Corporate and Supply Chain Security Services for SuperValu. He holds a BA in Criminal Justice, an MA in Public Safety Administration and is an instructor at St. Mary's University where he teaches on Workplace Violence Prevention and Response. He joined the corporate security ranks after a 20 year career with the New York City Police Department (NYPD). Among his assignments with the NYPD he was involved with the Major Case Squad, Organized Crime, Narcotics Division and was a first responder to attacks to the attacks on the World Trade Center on 9-11-01 and 2-16-93.

Dan's remarks will draw from his experiences and help to lead a discussion on these important topics. The American workplace has increasingly become a place where violence and the threat of violence are now more commonplace. Many organizations have taken proactive steps to ensure the safety and security of their most valuable asset – their employees. In this presentation he will define workplace violence and its four main types, discuss the nature and cultural context of human aggression, the history of workplace violence, legal aspects and civil liability involved, warnings signs and precursor behavior to violence, prevention strategies, several real-life case studies including some from his own experience, and resources available to help create an effective comprehensive workplace violence prevention program for your organization.
